Investigations/Significant Events

4/01 – Disturbance – Bulverde Hills. Dispatched to a residence for a disturbance between spouses. Parties were separated for the night. Report completed.
4/2 – Welfare concern-Taylor Point- All ok. Phone out of order.
4/2 – Comal County 100 Club Campaign at area McDonalds. BPD participated with SO at US 281 McDonalds-south of Guadalupe river.
4/2 – Disturbance - Bulverde Hills between husband and wife-neither party wanted to pursue charges. Husband left for the night.
4/2 – Suspicious Circumstances/Person – OVN.; Male jumping over back fence-15yr old girl’s boyfriend.
4/2 – Fatality Accident – Hwy 46. Four vehicle accident, 1 deceased, 2 transported by air life. Tandem axle dump truck (westbound) struck a PU in the rear which was stopped,

waiting to make a left turn. PU was pushed into the path of eastbound traffic where it impacted with two eastbound vehicles. Charges pending.

4/5 – Lost Property -OVN– Complainant reported a lost / stolen license plate from a trailer. Entered in TCIC / NCIC, report completed.

4/5 – BPD attended Windmill Ranch HOA meeting

4/5 – Burglary of Vehicle – OVN. Complainant states unknown subject entered her vehicle and stole medication. No forced entry-no suspects.

4/10 – MVA – Hwy 281. Three vehicle crash Hwy 281at FM 1863. Three persons transported for injuries, one transported by airlife. Hwy 281 shut down for short period.

4/10 – Bike Patrol Hwy 46 Business area.

4/12 – Hospice Death – OVN. 74 year old passed away while under Hospice care. Report completed.

4/12 – Public Intoxication – Bulverde Hills. Subject made contact with BFD staff at central station stating he was assaulted “5 miles down the road” but did not want to press charges. Subject appeared intoxicated and was released to his father. Report completed.

4/12 – Child Abuse – Bulverde Hills. Reporting party alleged child abuse against a spouse. A report was initiated and CPS was contacted, investigation continues.

4/13 – BPD attended Oakland Estates HOA meeting.

4/14 – Attempted Suicide – Shepherd’s Ranch. Female subject stated she took several prescription drugs. Subject was transported by EMS to hospital for evaluation.

4/14 – BPD participated in mentor program at Rahe / Bulverde Elementary.

4/15 – Deadly Conduct – HEB parking lot. Subject states he and a friend went to several locations and played pool for money. At some point there was a disagreement over money. Alleged victim, who was a passenger in a vehicle, states he was forced out at the HEB parking lot. Incident is under investigation.

4/15 – Disturbance – OVN. Parent called stating their daughter was out of control and damaging property. Officers assisted with transport to Laurel Ridge Hospital.

4/16 – Illegal Burn – Bulverde Business Dist. Subjects were observed burning illegal materials. Bulverde Fire Marshal called BFD to extinguish the fire. Report completed.

4/17 – Sexual Assault – OVN. Officers responded to complaint of a possible sexual assault which reportedly occurred one month earlier. Investigaton to SS for follow up.

4/19 – BPD attended Bulverde Hills HOA meeting.

4/20 – BPD attended mentor program at Bill Brown Elementary.

4/20 – Suicidal Subject – Shepherd’s Ranch. BPD responded for a suicidal subject and assisted EMS who transported subject to hospital for evaluation.

4/20 – BPD attended Oak Village North HOA meeting.

4/21 – Theft of License Plate – OVN. Caller reported a license plate missing from a trailer. LP entered TCIC/NCIC, report complete.

4/21 – BPD attended mentor program at Rahe / Bulverde Elementary.

4/21 – Theft – OVN. BPD responded to OVN for reported theft of campaign signs. Incident under investigation.

4/21 – Disturbance - Luke’s parking lot. BPD responded to a fight involving four male subjects. Subjects ran from officers. With assistance from CCSO, all four were located and arrested.

4/22 – BPD attended Guadalupe Valley Peace Officer’s Association quarterly meeting.

4/23 – Officer observed suspicious vehicle leaving the new Chicken Express restaurant at 0230 hrs. On stopping the vehicle, driver was found to be intoxicated. Two minor females (age 19) were intoxicated inside the vehicle. One of the females was found to have drugs in her purse.

The driver was arrested for DWI, and the female was charged with narcotics violations. Vehicle and other passengers were released.

4/24 – Theft \$0-50 Exxon Travelmart. Subject stole a carton of beer and ran out the door.

Vehicle was stopped by CCSO in the county. Subject was arrested, had warrants outstanding.

4/26 – Identity Theft-City Hall. Subject came to the PD and made a report for possible identity theft.

4/26 – Speeding Motorcycle evaded BPD north bound on 281 from 1863 area. Cycle and operator located by CCSO at 46 and 281. Operator arrested and transported.

4/28 – MVA- FM 1863. One vehicle crash with non-life threatening injuries. Two transported by EMS.

4/30 – Assist CCSO – Assisted with a vehicle pursuit where the vehicle eventually crashed in the county south of the river. Subject was apprehended and found to be in possession of items which were stolen from an Austin PD officer.

4/30 – Disturbance-Tetco Parking lot – Male and female subjects were having a verbal dispute. Subjects were separated for the evening.
