Investigations/Significant Events:

- 8/02 - Assault F/V – dispatched to an address on Hwy 46 for a disturbance. One male arrested for assault/family violence.
- 8/02 - Saturday morning Chief and Lieutenant attended a public function at the Bulverde Spring Branch Library.
- 8/2 Fire Investigation. Wildcat. Controlled burn. Officer requested by Fire Department.
- 8/3 - Theft of Service complaint/Civil Matter.
- 8/3 - Traffic Control 6400 Blk Fm 1863 for CPS and Bulv. Fire, reference a downed power line. Approx 30 mins.
- 8/04 - Lt. Haecker attended a Windmill Ranch HOA meeting Monday night. NNO presentation.
- 8/4 - Budget Workshop with Mayor, Council, and staff.
- 8/07 - Misc Information HEB. Officers were dispatched to the HEB where a 16 year old female stated that someone was following her and possibly taking her photo. Subject in question identified. Sgt Simpson conducted the investigation. No Criminal Conduct supported. Warning issued.
- 8/08 - Attended Death OVN. Officers were dispatched to OVN for a Hospice attended death. 67 year female diagnosed with lung cancer.
- 8/10 - Fatal MVA. Major accident in the 4300 blk of FM 1863. Male passenger was deceased. Driver was arrested and jailed for intoxication manslaughter. Magistrate set his bond at \$40,000.
- 8/11 - Theft \$500-1500 TSC. Theft of 2 mini-bikes from Tractor Supply. Occurred sometime between 7am and 7pm. Crime was featured by Crime Stoppers but no leads developed.
- 8/14 - Hwy 281. Off duty SAPD officer reported a road rage incident in the City. Officers responded and assisted. Statements were taken from parties involved. Follow-up by Steve Simpson. Case forwarded to the DA’s Office.
- 8/14 - Assist Animal Control. Officers were dispatched to the Highlands to assist with an AC problem.
- 8/15 - Theft \$50-500 HEB, CFS to HEB for theft of \$58.00 in fuel. No suspect or vehicle information provided.
- 8/16 - Criminal Mischief Bulverde Hills. CFS to Deerfield Terrace reference a damaged mailbox. Report taken. Extra Patrol initiated for location/area, especially night shift.

8/17 - Public Intoxication at Tetco. Officers observed a subject lying face down in the parking lot. Subject highly intoxicated. EMS requested for evaluation. CCSO jail referred to Christa Santa Rosa Hospital in New Braunfels due to alcohol level. Hospital advised BAC was .371. IV administered by hospital staff. Subject then transported to jail for public intoxication.

8/22 - 761 in Unit 601 struck small deer on Hwy. 46 east, 4 AM.

Officer in route to CCSO Jail with prisoner. Minor damage to front bumper and license plate holder only. Grill guard limited damage to unit.

8/25-8/27 - All Officers and supervisors assisted with Traffic Control as needed for the beginning of the school year.

8/22 - Runaway OVN, dispatched for a 16 year old runaway. The juvenile returned the following day.

8/24 - Disturbance Oakland Estates, dispatched for a bipolar schizophrenic male off his medication. Subject voluntarily went for an evaluation.

8/24 - Welfare Concern Oakland Estates, dispatched to a residence for an extremely intoxicated female. Upon arrival officers found a 5 year child in the home. Child was taken by relatives and Child Protective Services was contacted. Female was attended to by family members.

8/25 - Credit Card Abuse Oakland Estates, citizen states someone got her credit card number and used her card. A California detective called and has a suspect. Investigation continues, charges likely to follow.

8/27 - Assault Exxon Travel Mart, subject called stating he had been assaulted the day before at the Exxon. Suspect identified under investigation.

8/27 - Identity Theft City Hall, subject came to City Hall to report an identity theft. Suspect identified under investigation.

8/28 - Disturbance Oakland Estates, dispatched for a disturbance where an armed man had discharged a firearm inside a residence during a disturbance. Subject was stated to be suicidal. Subject was talked out of the house and was arrested for Deadly Conduct.

8/29 - MVA 33200 blk Hwy 281. One vehicle accident where a vehicle struck a large TxDOT sign, telephone pole, and then a fence. Driver fled on foot and was apprehended about 30 minutes later at Exxon. He was arrested for Failure to comply upon striking a fixed object.
