Investigations/Significant Events

3/02 – MVA in Oakland Estates knocked out power for several hours.
 3/04 – Vehicle fire OVN. BPD officer on patrol observed a vehicle on fire in a driveway. Fire was related to vehicle equipment. No injuries minor damage to home.
 3/05 – Burglary Tractor Supply. Officers dispatched for an alarm and observed a vehicle loading a go-cart. Two subjects fled south on Hwy 281 in a stolen van. Pursuit continued into San Antonio where subjects abandoned the vehicle. One possible suspect was identified. Chief and Lieutenant responded to TSC. All property was returned to TSC. CID doing follow-up.
 3/06 – Hit and Run Hwy 281. A vehicle struck another and fled the scene. A license plate was obtained and driver contacted. Possible charges to follow.
 3/07 – Saturday. Officer Edwards and Lt Haecker participated in warrant roundup with other LE agencies in the county. Over ten thousand dollars in Bulverde warrants have been collected as a result of the joint effort.
 3/11 – Disturbance- Bulverde Oaks. Open 911 call with a possible disturbance. Officers made an arrest for possession of marijuana and resisting arrest.

3/11 - Chief visited Bill Brown Elementary and Rahe/Bulverde Elementary for scheduled visit with principals and classes for Q & A with kids.
3/12 – Bulverde Hills. Dispatched for a possible suicidal subject. Checked out ok- Domestic issues. Referral in process.
3/13 – Criminal Mischief OVN. Report of vehicle driving through yards. Vehicle was located by CCSO and subjects identified.
3/14 – Suspicious Circumstances OVN. Subject received an inappropriate text message / picture on a cell phone. Under investigation.
3/17 – Chief Hamilton attended OVN HOA meeting for presentation and Q&A session.
3/19 – Criminal Mischief OVN. Several signs and mailboxes were damaged during the overnight hours. No suspects at this time.
3/20 – Burglary 30059 Hwy 281. Patrolman located a broken glass door on business. Under investigation.
3/20 – Disturbance Bulverde Hills. Dispatched for a family disturbance between a father and son. Parties separated for the night.
3/20 – Lt Haecker participated in a career day at Rahe / Bulverde Elementary.
3/21 – Assault OVN. Dispatched for an assault not in progress between an employer and ex-employee. Under investigation.
3/25 – Theft \$0-50 Tetco. Subject pumped fuel into their vehicle and drove away. Determined to be accidental and subject paid for fuel.
3/25 - 750-Board Mtg. for Children’s Advocacy Center of Comal County (New Braunfels). Safety presentation to kids at Cedar Hill Day Care (Bulverde). Q and A.
3/26 – 750 attended Bulverde Spring Branch Chamber event. Brief information sharing on recent criminal activity in the area. Q & A. Councilman Hurst in attendance.
3/27 – Vehicle Damage HEB. Complainant states when she came out of work it appears someone had struck her vehicle and left the scene. No leads.
3/28 – Aggravated Assault A vehicle was observed on the shoulder of Hwy 281. BPD stopped to assist and it was discovered that an Aggravated Assault had occurred. Party reported to have been forced to accompany assailant from location in San Antonio. Domestic origin. CID doing follow-up.
3/29 – Disturbance OVN. Disturbance between mother and daughter. Daughter left the residence prior to officer’s arrival. Incident is under investigation.
3/29 – Disturbance Hwy 281. Officers stopped a car for reckless driving. One male was arrested for assaulting his spouse while driving on Hwy 281.
3/30 – Hospice Death-Shepherd’s Ranch. 83 year old male died of natural causes. Hospice was on scene.
