Investigations/Significant Events:

10/1 – Returned Runaway. Subject reported as a runaway was located in the HEB parking lot. Subject detained and released to parents.
10/1 Meeting with Spring Branch school officials about traffic issues. 750 and John Nowak.
10/1 – Bulverde Jubilee Meeting, 7 PM.
10/2- 750- Check ride with 757 on night shift. Residential, Business and Traffic Patrol.
10/04 – Criminal Mischief - Bulverde Hills. Several mailboxes were damaged during the overnight hours. No suspects at this time. Referred to SS
10/07 – National Night Out 6p-9p – 9 block parties were arranged through coordination with the Police Department and local Homeowners Associations. Officers were divided into teams and rotated among block events. Councilman Binkley accompanied Chief Hamilton in attending as many functions as they could get to before the lights were turned off.
10/08—Joint mtg. at the Fire Station with Fire and EMS regarding Emergency Management issues, planning and preparation.
10/08 – Bulverde Hills. Vehicle struck a large rock and fence and left the scene. Suspect not identified.
10/09 – 750 attended Jubilee Meeting at 7 PM.
10/10 – Preparations for Bulverde Jubilee next date.
10/10 – Assist SO in Rimrock Ranch. Officers responded to a suicidal subject barricaded in a bathroom. Female subject controlled by Officer Adams and transported by EMS.
10/11 – Bulverde Jubilee Event. BPD manned the PD Booth, Mock Jail, Bicycle Rodeo, and assisted with the Parade, vehicle and pedestrian traffic. All went well.
10/11 – Disturbance in Oakland Estates. Two young brothers had a physical altercation. Aggressor fled the scene prior to arrival of Officers. Report forwarded to the DA’s Office.
10/12 – Disorderly Conduct Persimmon Hill. Complainant states while she was walking her dog, a male cyclist made offensive remarks towards her. Area search was unable to locate the subject.

Extra patrol for the area directed. Case forwarded to SS for assistance and follow up. No suspects at this time.

10/13 – Suicidal Subject Bulverde Hills. Subject made suicidal statements. Subject agreed to go with EMS to the hospital for an evaluation.

10/14- 750 Met with Chief Everett (New Braunfels) and Chief Matta (Garden Ridge). Meeting to discuss and address local law enforcement issues.

10/15 – 750 Attended monthly AACOG mtg.. (REPAC)

10/16 – Assist Other Agency. BPD was asked to assist at an address on Elm Valley-Swimming Pool Incident-County. Sgt. Vera initiated CPR on a two year old boy. Transported by EMS. Condition critical. Sgt Vera is to be commended for his response.

10/16- 750 & 790 Attended the Quarterly, Guadalupe Valley Peace Officer Association Meeting at Garden Ridge.

10/17 – Forgery- Broadway Bank. Report taken for a subject who was cashing checks against her account from another individual. SS

10/19 – Returned Runaway. Officers responded to the HEB parking lot and assisted a citizen with retrieving their juvenile child.

10/19 – Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle. Officer Ramos stopped a vehicle for speeding. Check revealed the 2008 model vehicle had been reported stolen the night before. One subject arrested for UUMV.

10/19 – Deceased Person Bulverde Oaks. 94 year old female passed from natural causes. Hospice was on scene.

10/21 – Burglary of Building. Antler Café was burglarized during the night time hours. The unopened safe was found in the parking lot. Case was featured by crime stoppers and is under investigation. No current suspects.

10/23 – 751 attended Bulverde Jubilee meeting. After Action Review

10/24 - Children’s Advocacy Center’s Multidisciplinary Team (MDT) liaison visit to BPD. Department.

10/25 - Big Trash Day at City Hall. Monitored by Steve Simpson

10/26 - Theft HEB. Subject pumped \$33.65 worth of fuel and left. LP obtained.

10/27 - Deceased Person Persimmon Hill. 58 year old female died as a result of illness.

10/30 - Court hearing at JP 2 regarding the ruling of ownership for property which was stolen from a vehicle last Oct 2007 at the Tetco Station at Hwy 281 and Hwy 46. Judge Dvorak ruled that the property, which was recovered from a pawn shop in San Antonio, be returned to the victim. Property returned in compliance with court order.

10/30 – Attended meeting reference the annual Christmas Lighting in the Village of Bulverde.

10/31- Halloween- BPD manned a booth at the annual event- HEB/Creekside Area. John Hobson, Chief, Lt. Haecker, and Steve Simpson. Safety materials distributed. 5PM to 7PM.
